

Welcome to the world of underwater exploration with Adelaar liveaboard, a unique and unforgettable way to experience the stunning beauty of Indonesia's marine life.



Daily Ship Routine

Our 10-night cruises include up to 33 dives, with a typical day as follows. The maximum dive time is 80 minutes and the maximum depth is 40 meters.

1st dive: 7am2nd dive: 10am3rd dive: 2pm

Night dive when scheduled: 6:30pm

Required Skills

For divers, the minimum requirement is Open Water Certification and 60 logged dives for all cruises. Anyone with less than 60 dives, under 12 years of age or over 75 years, will require a private dive guide. For our snorkeling guests, no experience required.

Dive & Travel Insurance

Mandatory diving insurance that includes medical evacuation is required for all diving guests. Travel insurance is highly recommended.

Dive Gear Rentals

Dive gear equipment rentals must be requested in advance.

Payment Onboard & Customary Crew Tips

For onboard incidentals we accept payments by MasterCard/Visa as well as in cash EUR, USD, CHF, or Indonesian Rupiah. Customary tips to the crew reflect your satisfaction with the service onboard.

Boarding, Disembarkation, & Transfers

Boarding time is typically 8am for Bali and 10am for all other ports. Disembarkation is at 10am for all ports. Transfers to and from the boat are included. For Bali, the transfer is for south Bali only. If you need additional transfers, please let us know and we are happy to organize.




